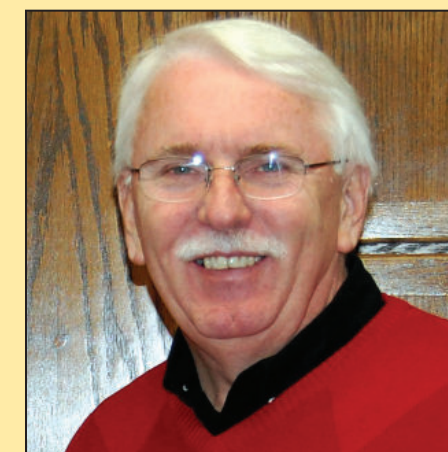
Thanksgiving season reminds me how blessed we are as a school, church,

From the School Nurse

Reporting of Injuries: Parents, please call the Health Office and inform us if your student has a serious injury or illness. Also, remember if your student is going to have a gym/sport restriction, we need a specific written note from the doctor, PA or NP when the student returns to school.

Medications in School: School personnel may dispense medication (including both prescription AND over-the-counter) to a student ONLY under the following conditions:

- A written order from the student's doctor stating medication, dosage, frequency, and reason are provided. (A prescription label, or parent instructions from the provider are NOT physical orders.)

- The parent must authorize in writing that school personnel may administer the medication.

To Stay at Home or Not – Here are some guidelines to use in determining whether your child should stay at home:

- Any condition that you think or know is contagious to others.

- Students with a fever must remain home and must not return to school until they have been fever-free (without fever-lowering medication) for 24 hours.

- Severe sore throat, with fever or lethargy, lasting longer than 48 hours (contact healthcare provider).

Reminder: If your child has had a throat culture for strep, he/she may **NOT** be in school until the results are known. If your child is diagnosed with strep, he/she **MUST** be on antibiotics 48 hours before returning to school. The school nurse must be notified if your child is being tested for strep, regardless of the results.

- Red, runny eyes until cleared as non-contagious by a healthcare provider.

- Severe ear pain or drainage from the ear (contact your healthcare provider).

- Severe headache, especially if accompanied by a fever (contact your healthcare provider).

- Honey-crusted sores around the nose or mouth which might be impetigo (contact your healthcare provider).

- Significant rash accompanied by a fever, sore throat, stomach ache, or a rash in various stages including boils, sores & bumps that might be chicken-pox (contact your healthcare provider).
